Save the Date: The 24rd Dog Day Afternoon Golf Tournament to be held September 19!

Make sure to mark your calendar now for the best golf tournament in northeast Georgia: The Dog Day Afternoon Golf Tournament, the top annual fundraiser for the Humane Society of Northeast Georgia (HSNEGA).

The 2011 Tournament will be held again at the Chattahoochee Golf Course on Monday, September 19. Registration begins at 10 a.m.; a catered lunch begins at 11 a.m.; the shotgun start takes place at 12:30 p.m.; and the awards and closing reception/light dinner will follow the end of play.

“The golf tournament is our oldest and most successful fundraiser, and is an event that the players look forward to each year,” says Rick Aiken, president of HSNEGA. “Our 2011 goal is \$40,000, and with the community’s support, I am confident we will exceed that amount.”

Entry fee is \$125 per player and includes 18 holes of golf, a cart, a pre-tournament lunch catered by The Longstreet Cafe, post-tournament reception including a light dinner and

prize, fabulous door prizes, and a “doggie bag” full of treats for every player.

The Tournament format is Lauderdale, four players per team. Handicaps will be determined by adding each team’s handicap together and dividing by 10. Team handicap will then be deducted from the gross score to determine team’s net score. Prizes awarded to the top 3 teams (net and gross).

Sponsorship opportunities for the Dog Day Afternoon Golf Tournament start at only \$150 and the tournament is limited to the first 32 teams to register. All monies raised from the event will be used to support rescued homeless animals find new homes and further our mission of education and wellness. OUR SERVICES INCLUDE:

Affordable Spay-Neuter Surgery: High-quality surgery available to public pet owners throughout the region by appointment for \$60-80 per animal.

Wellness Clinic: Low-cost (\$10) rabies shots and vaccines; heartworm testing and preventative, flea & tick treatment, and deworming.

Adoption of Companion Animals: \$70-100; All animals available for adoption have been spayed/neutered, are up-to-date on vaccines, microchipped and have undergone a health exam.

Fulfilling Needs through Fundraising

We all are very aware of the economic burden that has been placed on families and businesses, and especially non-profits, in the past several years. The Humane Society of Northeast Georgia (HSNEGA) has experienced its share of this burden, as well, and we are

grateful for those in the community who have continued to support our mission and services with their gifts, both big and small.

I have to admit, however, that I was surprised recently to learn that there are people in our community who do not realize that HSNEGA is a non-profit and relies on donations to help fulfill our mission. I also learned that many residents in the community do not fully understand HSNEGA's mission and the importance of what we do.

I will start with our mission and its importance. At its most basic level, HSNEGA's role in the community is to establish a community recognized for responsible pet ownership and humane treatment of animals by offering basic pet wellness and spay-neuter services, public education, and placement of rescued companion animals. We fulfill our mission in a wide variety of ways, from providing classroom education programs to offering basic, low-cost pet services to supporting other rescue groups and shelters in achieving their mission.

So what does this mean for the community at large? It means less risk of public health concerns such as rabies outbreaks; a reduction in pet overpopulation which minimizes the municipal costs for issues such as animal control; and a public which demonstrates concern for the well-being of all animals and respect

for conscientious pet owners and animal supporters. And, of course, there are the animals we rescue and give a second chance. Literally thousands of displaced, homeless pets in all shapes, breeds and sizes in need of loving, forever homes.

However, like all private non-profits, the Humane Society cannot fulfill its mission, or the needs of the community, without the financial support of the community. Currently, our services, which include our low-cost Wellness Clinic, Spay-Neuter Center and Adoption Center, only generate approximately half (52%) of the monies needed for our annual operating budget. **This means we need to generate another 48% of our income through monetary donations.**

Monetary donations can be made to HSNEGA in a variety of ways. Of course, individuals and businesses can support our fundraising events as sponsors and/or participants. HSNEGA also has a membership program for people who wish to support the shelter on an annual, ongoing basis.

Gifts also can be made in honor or memory of a beloved person or pet. We also are preparing to launch a kennel sponsorship program this summer for those who wish to give to directly help one of our rescued animals looking for a new home. Supporters also can support the shelter by naming HSNEGA as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy or in a will (also known as planned giving).

Regardless of how you choose to give, please consider a financial donation if you have not donated to HSNEGA, or if you are a dedicated supporter, consider how you can continue to support the shelter now and into the future. The Humane Society of Northeast Georgia has been a part of this community for almost 100 years and, with your help, we can continue to serve the people and pets of northeast Georgia for another century.
